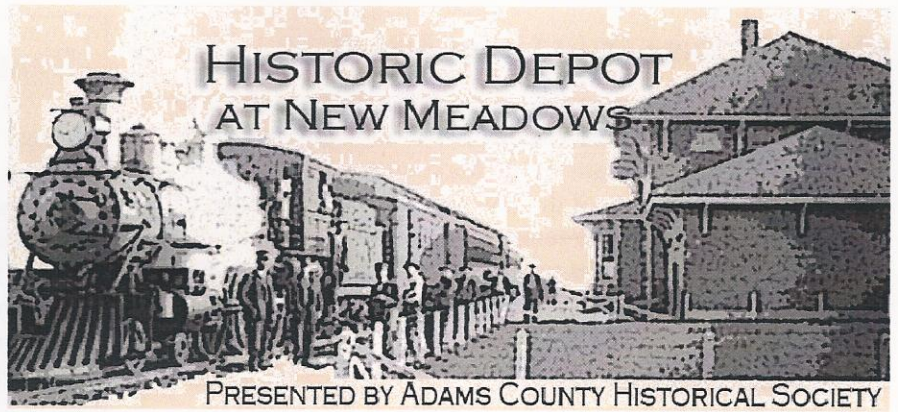


## Open For Business

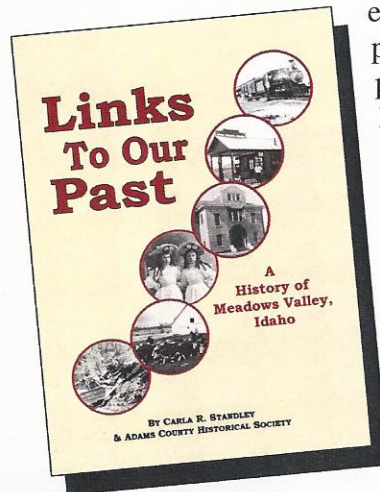
